**The First Reading** – Moses wants the Chosen People to be able to describe what God has done for them. We can be strong in our faith only when we have a sense that God has blessed us.

**The Second Reading** – To be a person of faith is to recognize that Jesus is Lord; but not only that: that recognition must be heartfelt – and what is heartfelt cannot but bear fruit in our lives.

**The Gospel** – Jesus was tempted – the Gospel is not pretending or exaggerating. Jesus had to stand his ground in the face of real, concrete temptation. It is to him we should run whenever we experience temptation.
