Readings

The first reading -The prophet Isaiah voices God's promise of remembrance for his people that reaches beyond even a parent's love for their child.

Lent is Coming: Lets Prepare well for Easter 2017

Please note: No flowers please to be left in the Church for the season of Lent, Thank you.

1st March is Ash Wednesday: Remember it is a day of Fast and Abstinence and a great opportunity to express our faith. Masses, with distribution of ashes, at 7am, 10am and 7pm. Don't forget Lent is 40 days of preparation, not a month! Remember too that our celebration after Lent lasts for 50 days (called the Easter Season), and is not just one day!

Lent Stations of the Cross: Will take place every Wednesday at 3pm during Lent, beginning on Ash Wednesday. Please do consider joining in this very appropriate 'way of the cross' in anticipation of Easter. Booklets will be provided. Do encourage a friend!

17th March 2017: Is the feast day of St Patrick. After the 10am mass, we hope once again to have a cake sale with tea and coffee in aid of the missions. This year we will divide the money raised between a Sacred Hearts

Community (SSCC) project run by our brothers in India (that looks after young adults) and a project run by a Divine Word Missionary (SVD) priest that cares for the poor living among the graves and tombs of the old Chinese cemetery in Cebu, Philippines.

Episcopal ordination of Jean Pierre COTTANCEAU sccc, archbishop of Papeete. On Friday, February 17 at 7:30

pm, there was a **prayer vigil** at the Cathedral to prepare spiritually for the ordination. The vigil began with Vespers conducted by the parish of the Cathedral. Adoration followed until midnight. In the year and a half since **Jean Pierre Cottanceau sccc** had become Apostolic Administrator of the Archdiocese of Papeete (Tahiti - French Polynesia) we could have begun to despair of ever seeing a bishop named. Indeed, there had been no bishop at the head of the archdiocese for nearly 6 years, and three apostolic administrators have succeeded one another throughout this time! But it is a done deal since the morning of **Saturday February 18, 2017**. Beginning at 8:30 am, more than 1000 choristers from the various parishes of the Archdiocese animated the ordination Mass. To these choristers we must add more than 1500 participants. The church of **Maria No Te Nau** near the archbishopric was not large enough and it was extended by two marquee. The seven concelebrating bishops were welcomed from the podium at the center of the assembly. There were the consecrating bishops: Most Reverend Michel CALVET Archbishop of Noumea who was assisted by Most Reverend Hubert COPPENRATH, Archbishop Emeritus of Papeete, and Most Reverend Pascal CHANG SOI sccc, Bishop of Taiohae
